













Reading Spine: Year 2



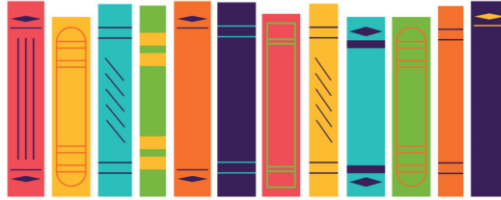

A selection of high-quality texts which are read to children as part of story time throughout the year.

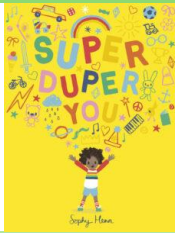

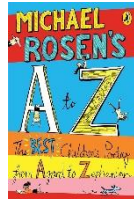


Poetry

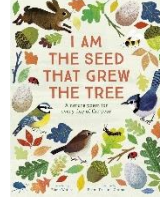

Non-Fiction

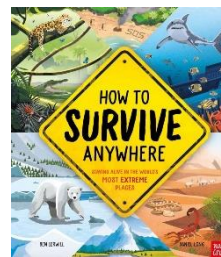

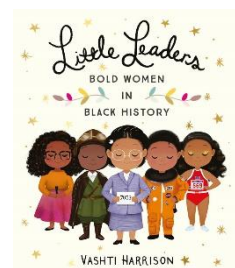
